- 2 We welcome two new Board Members Dale Unwin and Rob Spencer. We hope their time on the Board is both interesting and fruitful.
- 3 Version 2 of the Hamilton Park Common Lands Management Plan is now available on the Hamilton Park website. Written submissions about this Plan can be directed to <u>secretary@hamiltonpark.org.au</u> before the next Board meeting on Thursday February 18th when the Board intends to approve this plan. This will become the basis of the care and maintenance of our Common Lands until another review in 5 years, resident input is essential.
- 4 Changes to portfolio positions Sheree McKenzie has resigned from the Board and her position as Treasurer. On the 26th January we decided with the rain clouds gathering and the BOM forecasting a big dump of rain around 8am to postpone the event for one week.
