
Ecological Thinning Demonstration



Hamilton Park Cooperative have been successful in obtaining an environmental grant to undertake ecological thinning as part of the Bush for Birds Project.

Bush for Birds aims to improve habitat for two of Australia's most threatened birds— the critically endangered Regent Honeyeater and Swift Parrot.

Ecological thinning is the selective removal of trees within a dense patch in order to promote the growth of large old trees, which are an important habitat resource for wildlife.

Trust for Nature staff will provide a demonstration and will be on hand to answer questions about ecological thinning.

The demonstration will take place behind the Community Hub at the end of Kurrajong Lane between 1:00 pm and 4:30 pm. Chainsaws will be in operation, for safety reasons please keep clear of the marked demonstration area.
