Remove, dab or C&P	Weedy Shrubs, Asparagus, Black Nightshade, Briar Rose. Wonga Vine, Thistles, Prickly Lettuce. Fig, Stinkwort, St John’s Wort, weedy wattles & euc seedlings.
Control invasive grasses	Spot spray individual Paspalum, Dab Kikuyu, check for African Love Grass.
Rabbit action	Check, dig out any active burrows TARGET – NO OPEN BURROWS BY END APRIL
Plan cool burns	Discuss opportunities with Bpangerang project officers.
Check nestboxes	Andrew Snowden at RCoW unable to assist. Bees in Box 3. Relocate Box 5.
